Six members of the School Boat Club (with W. Kearsey and N. Cooper, old boys) won the  
longest event in the Rowing World, the 31-mile Boston Marathon, an open event in  
which 130 club crews competed. Their time broke the eight-year-old record for the race  
by six minutes and crews beaten included London Rowing Club (2nd) and University  
of London/Thames Tradesmen (3rd), the crew which had represented Britain in the  
Munich Olympics three weeks earlier.
