The Government's annual "School Attainment Tables" were published last month. It is, of course, heartening to see that our students achieve good results and that the School is 'adding value'. We were pleased to receive a letter of congratulation from the Schools Minister, Jacqui Smith MP. However the figure which gives me as much satisfaction as the examination results is the absence rate, at 3.3% it is significantly the lowest of all the county's schools. It suggests that pupils want to be at school, that they find being in school, learning, as relevant, enjoyable and interesting which is a credit to the quality of the teaching and the environment of Sir Thomas Rich's.

The traditional award of Honours is made each year to students who have made outstanding contributions to the life of the School. At the final assembly of last term we were delighted to present Honours to the following members of our U6th:



#### Mural

#### Performance Tables

Last month the Government's GCSE and A-level school performance tables were published, based on the 2005 results. The main figures for Rich's were:

- √ % gaining 5 or more GCSE passes at grades A\*-C = 100%
- KS2 to KS4 value added = 1020.5 (in top 25% of schools nationally)
- KS3 to KS4 value added = 1007.5 (in top 40% of schools nationally)
- ✓ Absence = 3.3%
- A-level average point score per student = 421.0 (based on A=120, B=100, C=80, etc.)
- ✓ A-level average point score per entry = 93.7

## Parents' Evenings

The new appointment system continues to meet with parents' approval. After the Y11 evening over 90% of responses were favourable, a few parents had no preferences and only one preferred the old system.

## Y9 GCSE Geology Fieldwork

On the Monday afternoon before the half term break 15 Y9 geologists, accompanied by Mr Green and Mr Carter, had their first taste of working in the field when they visited 2 local sites at Bromsberrow and Witford. They made sketches of the exposures, identified the rocks and structures and collected samples of the different sandstones in order to carry out some further analysis in the laboratory. GCSE Geology is taught on three lunchtimes per week and the course is completed in one year.
